












Dear families,















Wow Moment!

Maple Class also had a super time face painting. This activity engaged lots of the class the children were very intrigued in looking at them selves on the camera as we took selfies of our amazing face painting.

















For example the rocket balloons have been a big hit and we have added these onto our pointing boards for choosing during play in class. The pupils enjoyed exploring the mini ball pit in the classroom and throwing different balls both inside and outside. Jelly week was messy and fun and we had some pupils who are often reluctant to touch messy play explore the texture of the jelly. Some of Pine class pupils have joined pupils from across school on trips to soft play and we are looking forward to these visits continuing. We have also been building their confidence in accessing the hall for sensory circuits and exploring a range of different activities in the sensory park. 

We are looking forward to Halloween and visiting the local community very soon.





































We have also been thinking about our jobs and careers and we have really enjoyed creating our own products to sell and exploring ways of advertising and selling our products.
























Poplar together with Cedar students have enrolled in new college courses this term we are studying hair and beauty and motor mechanics.
