




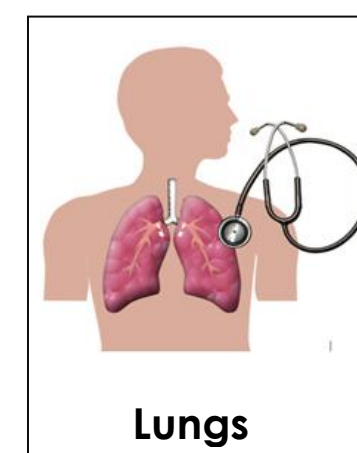
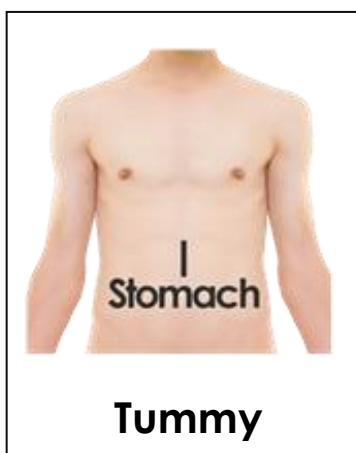
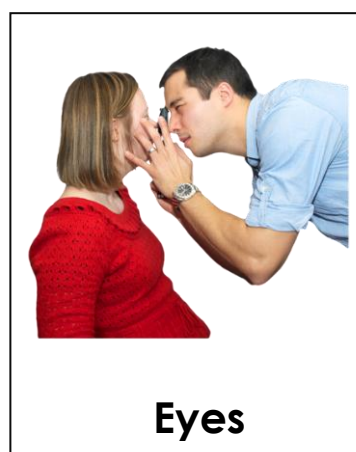
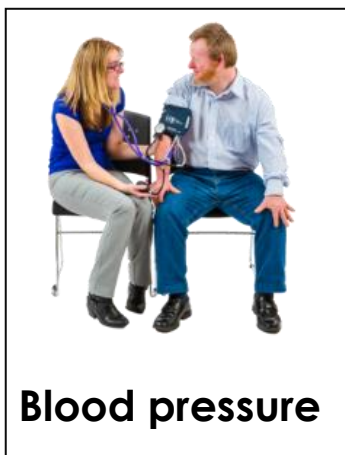


What Happens at Learning Disability Annual Health Check appointment?

“Anyone with a Learning Disability aged 14 or over, can get a free Learning Disability Annual Health Check at their doctor’s surgery.”

 <p>Doctor’s Surgery</p>	<p>You go to your doctor’s surgery for the Annual Health Check on the date and time of your appointment</p>
	<p>Annual Health Check is a head-to-toe health check</p>
	<p>Your doctor’s surgery may ask to do part of your annual health check on the telephone or video call</p>
	<p>Your appointment needs to be at least 30 minutes long</p>
	<p>Your doctor’s surgery may ask you to bring a sample of your wee</p>

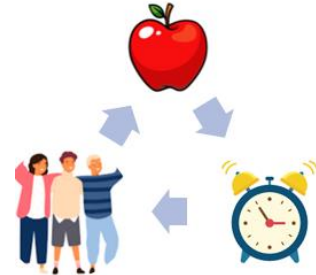

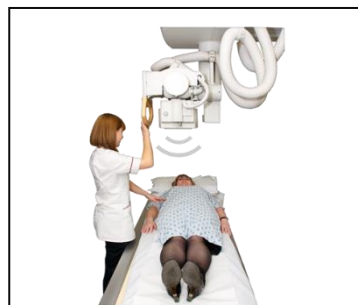
