

What is Safeguarding?

Brackenfield School will support you to be safe, this might be in school, at home or in the community. We will listen to you and take your worries seriously. You might be worried or scared because you are being hurt or someone is being unkind; this is called abuse.

There are different types of abuse:

Emotional	When you are not able to express your feelings, or when other people use feelings to hurt you.	₹ ≪®
Physical	If someone does something that hurts you, like hitting, shaking, throwing, burning you, or says you are ill when you are not.	
Sexual	Someone tells you to do something that involves your or their pants area or you are asked to watch something that shows someone's pant area.	
Neglect	If you don't have food to eat, clothes to wear, if you are not looked after by the people at home.	
Online	Someone might ask you to tell them where you live or go to school, or ask you to send photos of yourself. Someone may say unkind words to you.	
Community	Someone might ask you to do something you know is wrong, like steal sweets or take a parcels from one place to another. People might shout at you, hit or tease you.	

If you are Worried or Scared - Tell Someone

- Do tell them to stop
- Do tell someone, anyone in school can help
- Do call childline on 0800 1111 if you are not at school
- Do remember the PANTS rule :



- Don't think it's your fault
- Don't keep it a secret
- Don't talk to strangers or do things they ask
- Don't send picture of yourself undressed to others



What is Bullying?

Bullying is hurting someone more than once on purpose. People can be hurt by using actions or words. Brackenfield School will always take bullying seriously.

There are different types of bullying:

Emotional	Leaving people out, not letting people sit or play with them	
Physical	Using your body to hurt someone	Å
Verbal	Teasing, name calling, spreading rumours	₽
Written	Letters, notes, graffiti	*
Cyber	Using text, email or the internet to say unkind things	

If you are Being Bullied - Tell Someone

- Do ask them to stop if you can
- Do ignore them
- Do walk away
- Do talk to a friend
- Do get help from a teacher
- Don't do what they say
- Don't say or do unkind things
- Don't think it's your fault
- Don't keep it a secret

If you see Someone Else Being Bullied - Tell Someone

- Don't ignore it
- Do ask the bully to stop if you can
- Don't join in
- Don't say or do unkind things to the bully
- Do get help
- Do tell a someone what happened


Pupil Complaints Policy

What is a Complaint?

A complaint is when you tell someone if you are not happy about how you are being treated.

This might be a complaint about the school, a teacher or what you are learning.

You can complain by:

- Writing it down
- Talking to someone
- Fill in a complaint card
- Use the QR code to complete the form online

When you make a complaint this is what will happen:

- Someone will listen to you and take notes.
- Your complaint will be passed to the right person
- The right person will look into the complaint
- Someone will let you know what has done about it
- You can ask for the complaint to go to the Head teacher if you are not happy with what has been done about the complaint





What is online?

Information and Communications Technology covers lots of things including;

- Websites
- E-mail, Instant Messaging and chat rooms
- Social Media, including Facebook and Twitter
- Mobile/Smart phones, Tablets and Ipads
- Gaming, especially online such as PlayStation, Xbox
- Learning Platforms and Virtual Learning Environments
- Blogs and Wikis
- Podcasting
- Video Broadcasting, including live streaming
- Music Downloading

How to be safe online:

- Do use your own log in and not other peoples
- Do follow the schools online rules
- Do only use the websites that you are allowed
- Do check the age of games/apps/movies/music are appropriate
- Don't tell people your passwords
- Don't tell people your personal information, such as name, address, telephone number
- Don't arrange to meet people who you know online
- Don't use unkind words when talking, texting, or emailing someone
- Don't download anything without checking with an adult

What can I do if something online worries me?

- Tell someone
- Complete a school online safety log
- Call childline if you are not at school 0800 1111

If you don't know someone in real life don't friend them online
